Every weekend the students of HEA's School of Front Line Missions leave our center & travel deep into the mountains with their Field Trainers. They go to help local pastors plant new churches by putting into practice what they have learned in our school during the week as they study to be missionaries!

“Vision Driven Missions”

The students can't be in HEA's school unless they are called by God to be missionaries and chosen by their own pastors to be in our school.

Every pastor & their student is scheduled for a 3 hour interview with HEA Staff. Half of the interview is with the pastor & half with their student. We must know that we are preparing them to return & work under **Leaders of Vision**.

If they are accepted in our school, their pastors are also agreeing to come and visit their student once each month to check on their grades & show that student that they are an important part of their pastors **Vision to “reach their world!”**

When the students go out every weekend, many times their staying with families who live in board homes with tin roofs. Some have dirt floors and cook on open wood fires. HEA purchases a new sleeping bag and floor-mat for each student & we have heavy duty covers made for them so they can use them for years after they graduate!

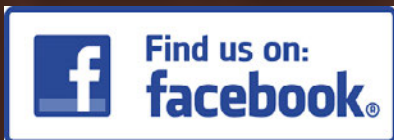

What an amazing missions tool.

A few years ago we were in the F-250 on a trip deep in the mountains to remote missions & the truck turned over 200,000 miles. (above). The truck had served HEA for 20 years of endless rock roads, crossing rivers, etc & was very worn out. It was so important to HEA!!

This 4x4 truck has gotten us into & out of so many very difficult areas! It has also been an incredible part of us bringing down donated fire gear from the USA... It has even led to our Fire Chief Marco & numerous other firemen's salvations!! This has given HEA much favor with the government of Mexico!! Chief Marco even sets our truck and trailer up as a Fire Truck (lights & all) to help traveling through Mexico.

We sold the truck (which was over 20 years old and very worn out) to help pay the factories for the Kingdom Kids Christmas Backpack supplies... We kept the trailer. We are planning to buy the new truck here in Chiapas. We will pray as God provides the miracle!!! Greg
